SOLICITOR:

The Solicitor stated, "In accordance with the Open Public Meetings Act of 1975, this meeting is called to order pursuant to both, adequate notice and electronic notice of a Regular Meeting, a copy of which has been made available to newspapers of general local public circulation, a copy of which has been made available to the Clerk of Gloucester County, a copy of which has been posted publicly and a copy of which has been posted online in the Authority's website in accordance with the law. Members of the public may make public comments remotely during a remote public meeting when permitted in accordance with the meeting agenda. Members of the public may submit public comments in writing forty-eight hours in advance of a remote public meeting to be read aloud during public comment. All public comments, whether made remotely or in writing in advance of a remote public meeting, shall be limited to five (5) minutes per person. Members of the public attending the meeting shall be muted until public comments are permitted, at which time they may ask to be recognized. In the event that a member of the public becomes disruptive during a remote public meeting, including during public comment, the Board Chair, or his/her designee, shall mute or continue muting such disruptive member

of the public. After receiving a warning, continued disruptive acts may result in such disruptive individual being muted, kept on mute for the remainder of the meeting, or removed from the meeting at the discretion of the Board Chair. During the course of the meeting, a portion of the meeting may be closed to the public to discuss matters falling under exceptions to the Open Public Meetings Act".

TEXECUTIVE DIRECTOR REPORT:

- E.D. Gober indicates the development team for the RCSJ project met, Deptford Townships' Redevelopment Plan will be introduced May 3rd and adopted June 14th. The funding source identified is the NJDCA affordable housing trust fund who have opened to accept applications which are due June 30th.
- E.D. Gober indicates the NJHMFA visited Colonial Park on February 26, 2021 to perform a Management Review and we received a rating of Superior. E.D. Gober thanks AHO Director, Paul Letizia and his staff for a job well done.
- E.D. Gober indicates that HUD is resuming inspections on June 1st, they are not going to score they are just looking for health and safety hazards.
- The Financial report indicates a net loss of \$597,000, after depreciation. OPEB and GASB adjustments are positive \$153,000. It also shows an approximately \$77,000 increase to salaries based to the average of Jan. and Feb., from the retro issued March 31st.
- E.D. Gober indicates in the agenda is resolution #21-26, a resolution of appreciation for the County of Gloucester for all they did for our staff and residents, coming out to administer the vaccines. The COVID numbers included in the packet show a downward trend. We will reach out to the County to see if they will come out one last time to administer the single dose J&J vaccine for those that can not get to the mega site. Our buildings are about 80% vaccinated.
- E.D. Gober indicates that last Board Meeting a resolution for Excess Liability insurance was rejected, resolution #21-22 is on the agenda this meeting for Excess Liability insurance after being rebid.
- Chairman William W. Bain Jr. adds the bid was reissued for Excess Liability insurance and the only company to respond was the same company as before with no bid changes. Also included in the agenda are two resolutions ratifying approval for emergency repairs.
- Chairman William W. Bain Jr. thanks the Commissioners for their time, effort, and participation in the Board Meetings.
- Commissioner Brenden Garozzo thanks Chairman William W. Bain Jr. and E.D. Gober for running the board meetings so efficiently.
- E.D. Gober indicates that financial disclosures from the Commissioners are due June 30th.
